score (regardless of whether or not they passed the assessment). ☐ Graduations Requirements/Pathways ☐ Act 158, relating to Graduation Pathways, was supposed to take effect with the Class of 2022 (current juniors). Due to the pandemic, and the passing of Act 136, graduation requirements have been delayed and will now begin with the Class of 2023 (current sophomores). ☐ Some graduation pathways require "proficient" scores and some require a numerical composite score. For students who were exempted from taking the Keystone Exam in SY19-20, if they need it to graduate (Class of 2023 and beyond), they can still sit for the assessment between now and graduation to obtain a numerical score. That score will only count for graduation purposes. We were told that those scores will never count towards building level scores. □ Waivers ☐ There has been discussion about a possible accountability waiver under a new president and federal secretary of education, but that remains to be seen. A testing waiver from the federal government for SY20-21 is not expected. ☐ Mrs. Husack asked what we are doing to monitor our students locally. Dr. Stoker shared examples of local assessments and frequency. Overview of Accessing Online Platform from a Family Perspective (Principals) ☐ Mr. Schnyderite shared on behalf of Peters Elementary School: Offered evening sessions to increase student engagement in the virtual environment, parenting through crisis led by Centers for Humanistic Change. Upcoming sessions will focus on instruction, such as utilizing Eureka Math. Also, reading strategies for young/new readers will be present in February and March. ☐ Monthly Family Engagement meetings are held for both elementary schools. This has helped decrease the frequency of parents reporting concerns. ☐ Mr. Schnyderite shared that more students are selecting the 5-day model for remote learning. Peters Elementary is considering solutions to decrease the number of students on the 5-day remote model. ☐ Mr. Pyne shared on behalf of Slatington Elementary echoed much of what Mr. Schnyderite shared.
